<u>HANON</u> Put your Palm Pom on your Right Hand. Play RH alone up and down. REALLY CONCENTRATE on playing with round, strong fingers - especially, the last little bend on each finger. 						
<u>SCALES AND TWO HAND CHORDS</u> C, Am, G, Em, F, Dm two scales every day Remember to say the WORDS and say the chord names OUT LOUD!	C Am	G Em	F Dm	C Am	G Em	F Dm
<u>COMING ROUND THE MOUNTAIN</u> Point and SING along with the “point and follow” music Play the two-hand chords in the song as BLOCK CHORDS Can you play the two-hand chords the way that they are written?						
<u>FOLK DANCE</u> Point and SING along with the “point and follow” music every day Work on whole song LH WITH the “play along” music						
<u>POLKA MAZURKA</u> Point and follow along with the “point and follow” music Listen very carefully while you point Preparation for Magenta section 3 with the “play along” music FINISH filling in the song: 1. write the counts 2. draw a line straight down from all of the #1s 3. Use your chord chart to write the correct chord names, notes, and finger numbers						
<u>RUSSIAN DANCE</u> Point and follow along with the “point and follow” music every day Sing eight measures slowly and correctly every day Preparation for Magenta section 1 with the “play along” music FINISH filling in the song: 1. write the counts 2. draw a line straight down from all of the #1s 3. Use your chord chart to write the correct chord names, notes (piggy chunk chunk style), and finger numbers						
<u>RIGADOON</u> Point and follow along with the “point and follow” music Listen very carefully while you point Continue working on the two-hand chords - little pieces each day						
<u>SARABANDE</u> Point and follow along with the “point and follow” music Listen very carefully while you point
